and the	Accordingly, based on our request, the State Government entrusted the work to state PWD and accorded a sanction for Rs. 2.90 crores. However, the					

specification adopted by the State PWD is not in consonance with the sit condition for long stability besides only part of the allotted land was covered

These anomalies had been brought to the notice of the Collecto Kurnool and requested to do the needful by providing a detailed drawing an specification for the compound wall. The State Govt. after due consideratio of these anomalies, issued a revised sanction for Rs. 6,16,71,000 (Annexure-1). This matter was taken up with the collector and collector was requested for early allotment of funds to take up the work after identifyin correct boundary by the revenue officials.

The BWC, in its in the 20<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 15-06-2017, noted the revised sanction of Govt. of A.P and resolved to take up the work as per the provisions of revised sanction accorded by the Govt. of Andhra Pradesh and when funds are available under resolution 8/2017.

The entire matter was communicated to the Secretary, MHRD, an Department of Higher Education seeking formal permission to construct th compound wall as per the revised specification. However, the Ministry vid its letter No. F.NO. 75-3/2016 TS.1 dated 14-12-2016. (Annexure 2) commented the following:

"State Govt.'s estimate through APPWD is only Rs.2.90 Cr. whereas that of IIIT through CPWD is Rs. 6.17 Cr. There is no point spending huge sum of money for the boundary wall. State Government of Andhra Pradesh shoul take immediate steps for constructing boundary wall, as it is an isolated are and shifting without the boundary wall will not be safe."

The Governing body of the society, during the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting held on 02 02-2017, under the Chairmanship of the Secretary(HE) at New Delhi resolve to adopt the design proposed originally by AP PWD and take up th construction accordingly vide Item No. 9 of the minutes.(Annexure-3).

Even though the APPWD had initially prepared the estimate for a amount of Rs.2.90 crores, the same is found not suitable on account o following reasons.

1) The originally proposed construction was with load bearing structure with 750 mm wide foundation with excavation of

earth for foundation trench throughout the length of compound wall and 380mm thick R.R Masonry in super structure. Since the site is of rocky and hilly terrain where excavation of trenches for the entire stretch is not feasible.

2) The estimate was covered the extent of 124.11 acres only against the total extent of 151.51 acres actually allotted and taken over by the Institute.

Considering the above technical aspects, it is proposed to adopt a specification of framed construction with RCC column founded at a distance of 4.50m C/C with 230mm thick fly ash brick masonry wall supported by grade beams throughout the length of compound wall with an estimated cost of Rs6,16,71,000/- approved by the State Government.

TheBWC deliberated the whole issue and resolved to recommend to theGoverning Body/MHRD to approve the revised sanction as accorded by the Govt. of AP and take up the work accordingly. The committee further advised the institute to prepare a detailed note incorporating comparison of original sanction and revised sanction accorded by the Govt. of AP with all relevant details and submit the proposal before the GB/MHRD for accord of approval.

Approval for foreclosure of the Infrastructure works in progress in the permanent Campus of IIITDM Kurnool

solution 13/2017 The Committee was informed that after obtaining necessary approval of the Governing body of the society under the chairmanship of the Secretary,(HE),MHRD, New Delhi , AA & ES for the following works were accorded to CPWD for taking up the development of Infrastructure in the permanent campus of IIITDM Kurnool. Out of total sanction of Rs. 83.19 Cr., the work of Construction of Hostel No.III has not been taken up for want of adequate funds. The remaining works for the sanctioned amount of Rs. 46.20 Cr., works have been commenced at site and the status of works is shown as under:

A total amount of Rs.14.00 Cr. only has been deposited to CPWD so far against the sanctioned amount of Rs. 46.20 Cr. (excluding the SI.No.5i.e. C/O Hostel Block No.III). Due to non-receipt of allotted funds during the current financial year 2017-18, works are not progressing at a faster pace. As per the MoU signed with the CPWD, the Institute is required to ensure availability ofadequate funds with CPWD at all times for execution and smooth progress of the work, but the same could not be achieved due to shortage of funds. Funds were last released during 09/2016 and ever after almost a year, no fund could be released to CPWD. It was anticipated that the Institute will receive funds from the budget allocation of Rs.30.00Cr. during the financial year 2017-18. But, no amount has been received so far in spite of bestefforts and also it is not known when the funds would likely to be released from the Ministry.

The SE, CPWDcommunicated that the deposits made so far to CPWD isexhausted and requested the Institute to deposit the balance amount for the execution of ongoing works. He furtherintimated that in the event of non-release of deposit to CPWD, the ongoing worksmay be either be suspended or foreclosed with immediate effect to stop creation of further liability and also cautioned that suspension of work may create contractual and legal obligations (Annexure-4). It was also informed to the committee

that the CPWD has been requested not to take any action regardir foreclosure till 30-11-2017

The BWC, after due deliberation, resolved to recommend to the Governing Body/MHRD to foreclose the ongoing works under sl.no 2 to and 6 &7 mentioned in the above statement avoid contractual and legical obligations. The committee further advised the institute to seek timefrom CPWD till 31-12-2017 and request for necessary details regarding liability and contractual implications likely to arise on account of foreclosing congoing works from CPWD and place the issues before the GB/MHRD for it consideration.

### Item 4

Accord of revised Administrative Approval & Expenditure Sanction for Revised Preliminary Estimate of Boys Hostel II in the permanent Campus of IIITDM Kancheepuram.

# Resolution 14/2017

The committee was informed that the sanction for Construction of Boy Hostel Block II was accorded vide AA&ES No 15 under reference IIITDM/5(22/2011 dated 30.08.2011 based on the Preliminary Estimate (PE) No 10/11/3/2004-Works dated 04.08.2011 for an amount of Rs 29,86,76,277 (Annexure 5) .

In order to meet immediate requirement, CPWD was requested to take u the work on phases(Phase I (G+2 Floors) with foundation and super structur work with G+2 )for accommodating July 2012 Intake students vid IIITDM/5(52)/2011/1502 dated 17.10.2011 (Annexure 6), keeping AA&E intact for the whole work.

To accommodate July 2013 batch intake, CPWD was once again requested take up additional three floors (3rd to 5th Floors) as Phase II work vide lette No. IIITDM/5(52)/2011/585 dated 13.09.2012 (Annexure 7). This was take up due to increase in student strength with each intake. This expansion was carried even though students were occupying G+2 floors of this Hostel.

Both Phase-I and Phase-II construction were completed and handed over at final cost of Rs6.63 Crores and Rs6.02 Crores respectively.

In order to complete the entireblock of Boys Hostel II(G+14); Construction of Phase-III (6th Floor to 14th Floor) was requested in April 2014 and complete at a cost of Rs.20.22 crores. Thus total amount works out to Rs. 32.87 Crore (Rs6.63+Rs6.02+Rs20.22)

While executing Phase III work, some additional works such as Safety Grills, RC Fin drop extensions, Trellis, Booster pumping system, RO Water supply system etc. had been included. Since the construction is carried out over a period from 2011 to 2016, the cost index has increased from the one adapted for the preparation of Original PE in 2011.

Accordingly a Revised Preliminary Estimate has been submitted by CPWD for Rs32,86,77,000/- (CPWD/19(3)/IIITDM-PC/2017/1406 dated 19 Sep 2017 - Annexure 8) taking into actual expenditure of Phase I, Phase II and Phase III constructions. Since the deviation amounted to Rs 3,00,00,723/- which is slightly more than 10% of original PE for Rs29,86,76,277/-, a revised AA&ES is required to be issued.

The BWC, after due deliberation, resolved to recommend to the BOG to accord revised Administrative Approval and Expenditure Sanction for the Revised Preliminary Estimate for an amount of Rs.32,86,77,000/-.
