	The BWC, after due deliberation, resolved to confirm the minutes of the 26 th meeting held on 30 th January, 2021.

Resolution No. BWC- 27(2022)-02	In the 26 th meeting of the BWC, the BWC was requested for approval for award of arbitration case in respect of construction of Lab (South and North) Block. The BWC, after due consideration, resolved to recommend for consideration of FC and BoG for according approval for settlement of Arbitration award amounting to ₹1,56,00,363 including interest amount till date of settlement of payment.				
	As the arbitration award is interest bearing, in principle approval was obtained from Chairman, FC/BoG and the ministry was requested for providing necessary funds. However, the ministry advised the Institute to settle the award from IRG and accordingly, the arbitration amount including the interest component as on 19/03/2021 totaling to Rs.1,60,00,416/- (principal amount Rs.1,56,00,363/- + interest as on date Rs.4,00,053/-) was released to CPWD against full and final settlement of the arbitration.

In the EFC meeting held on 31.08.2018, the EFC approved the revised cost estimate of ₹461.81 crore for IIITDM Kancheepuram. The approval of EFC, inter alia include, release of funds for settlement of liability and completion of balance infrastructure works amounting to ₹49.67 crore as under:

In line with approval of BWC, the Institute released ₹35.35 crore to CPWD for completing the above works as well as settlement of past liabilities.

3) Subsequent to this, Sh. Praveer Saxena, Under Secretary, Ministry of Education visited the institute to review the status of completion of infrastructure works approved by the EFC. In the meeting held on 26.03.2019, it was decided to complete the balance works viz. Faculty housing phase –II (40 units); Laboratory South block (5th to 6th floor) and North Block (4th to 6th floor). It was also decided to seek demand note from CPWD and release the balance funds by 31.03.2019 so as to complete all the works approved by the EFC. A copy of minutes of the meeting is placed as **Annexure B** for kind perusal of BWC.

In line with the discussion, the institute released the balance fund of ₹29.11 crore thus totaling ₹64.46 crore to CPWD for settlement of liabilities and for new works. These works have been taken up by the CPWD as Phase II.

4) After completion of works, CPWD submitted utilization certificate for all the assigned works after foreclosure and the details are as under:

The details of utilization are provided at **Annexure C.** This includes settlement of past liability settled by the CPWD and the details of the same provided by the CPWD is at **Annexure D**.

5) At present, CPWD vide its letter dated 21.03.2022 and 23.03.2022 requested us to deposit an amount of ₹1.75 crore for settlement of pending running bills, the details of the same is as under:

- A copy of CPWD letter dated 23.03.2022 along with copy of running bills is placed as **Annexure E**.
- 6) It is pertinent to mention that the matter of requirement of additional deposit was made by CPWD vide its letter dated 07.01.2021. The matter was discussed with CPWD immediately and it was informed to CPWD that the entire capital amount of ₹64.46 crore were released to CPWD in March 2019 to clear the pending liability as well as for completion of balance works. Further, the Institute and CPWD have agreed in multiple meeting that they will work and complete the projects within the amount sanctioned and deposited to CPWD. Accordingly, CPWD was requested to verify the accounts of both civil and electrical division. A copy of letter addressed to CPWD by the Institute is placed as **Annexure F**. The matter was also taken up subsequently with CPWD.
- 7) The total funds deposited with CPWD was reconciled and the matter was taken up with CPWD for pending utilization. CPWD has, in turn, submitted utilization details up to 31.03.2022 and utilization is pending for ₹42.62 lakhs and reconciliation for balance amount is under progress. In addition, work completion certificate will be obtained from CPWD for all completed works.
- 8) In its letter CPWD, further intimated the clause (7) of General Conditions of Contract(GCC) of CPWD and as per this clause "the amount admissible shall be paid by 10th working day after the day of presentation of the bill by the contractor. In case of delay in payment of intermediate bills after 45 days of submission of bill by the contractor, provided the bill submitted by the contractor found to be in order, a simple interest @5% per annum shall be paid to the contractor from the date of expiry of prescribed time limit which will be compounded on yearly basis." It is intimated by the CPWD that the bills have been submitted by the contractor on 14.12.2020 and 30.09.2021.

The BWC discussed the matter and opined that all the assigned works should have been completed by the CPWD within the amount deposited by the Institute. The matter of additional works assigned to CPWD was discussed and the status is as under:

	The Institute is in receipt of all pending work completion certificate and in case Faculty Quarters and Lab, the pending liability amount ₹1.75 crore is indicated by the CPWD. The BWC noted the status including additional works awarded by the Institute. As these works are essential for successful occupation of the building, the BWC after deliberation, recommended the proposal to FC/BoG for payment of deposit amount of ₹1.75 crore to CPWD towards pending liability.

Accordingly, the TWAD has submitted a revised proposal costing ₹390.22 lakhs for implementation of the scheme and ₹20.78 lakhs for maintenance of the scheme. On account preparation of detailed estimate, TWAD Board has requested the Institute to remit balance DPR preparation cost of ₹1.73 lakhs after adjustment of initial deposit of ₹6.00 lakhs. A copy of a letter along with estimate is placed as **Annexure G**. BWC, after due deliberation recommend the proposal for consideration for release of ₹1.73 lakhs to TWAD Board towards preparation of DPR for Water supply scheme. Item No.5 Fixation of Water Charges in Faculty Quarters The Institute is having 76 quarters and over 65 quarters have been occupied at present. Resolution No.BWC-The Institute has been collecting electricity charges as per tariff 1(C) of TANGEDCO 27(2022)-05 @₹4.60 per unit even though the institute is drawing power at HT tariff. The Institute has requested TANGEDCO to provide separate connection for faculty quarters and the matter is under process. With regard to water, the institute has so far been providing water to quarters without collecting any charges as the students are not inside the campus on account of covid and there is minimum usage. However, water usage is reached its peak @4 lakhs per day and there is likelihood for purchasing water from outside. It is therefore proposed to charge for water usage at Quarters in a flat rate. Chennai Metro is charging a minimum of ₹4per KL upto 10KL and charging @₹16.00 for one KL upto 15 KL. TWAD Board is charging ₹30 per KL for supply to educational institutions. However, the institute is sourcing water mainly from internal resources. BWC noted the charges prescribed by the Chennai Metro and TWAD Board besides the water charges collected by the IIT Madras. After due deliberation, BWC recommended for collecting ₹400 in case of 3 BHK and ₹300 for 2BHK as water charges from the quarters. Item No.6 Request made for Funds under HEFA BWC-Recently, Ministry of Education vide its letter dated 31.03.2022 advised the Institute to provide the projected fund requirement for a period of 5 years under Higher Education 27(2022)-06 Financing Agency (HEFA). The requirement was deliberated internally and a need is felt for additional hostel for boys and also a water supply scheme. Based on the preliminary estimate, the construction of Hostel and allied infrastructure works out to be ₹60 crore.

Accordingly, the following projection has been made for fund requirement under HEFA.

BWC took note of requirement projected by the Institute. BWC further advised the Institute to place a detailed proposal along with DPR for consideration/approval of BWC before availing loan amount from HEFA.
