Thus a total of **380** students and scholars will be awarded degrees in the 10th convocation of the Institute. The graduating students have requested for provisional certificate for their higher education/employment. With the approval of the Chairman, Senate, the Institute has awarded the Provisional Degree to all eligible graduating batch of 2022.

It is requested that Senate may kindly approve the list of students for award of degrees in the forthcoming convocation and ratify the approval of Chairman, Senate in award of Provisional certificates to the graduating students of 2022 batch.

Further, Senate may also consider to authorize the Chairman Senate to award Provisional degree certificates to all eligible graduating UG/PG/Ph.D batch of 2022 who are completing the requirement after the convocation.

The Senate approved the list 380 number of eligible students, placed before the Senate, for awarding the Degrees in the ensuing 10th convocation of the Institute.

In respect of Ph.D scholars, a request was made to consider the scholars who complete their defence by mid of August 2022 for award of degrees. However, the Senate opined that adequate time need to be given to scholars for incorporating the comments of the examiners to ensure the quality of the thesis work. Further, there is a provision to award provisional degree to scholars after successful completion of their defence. However, taking sympathetic view, the Senate authorized the Chairman Senate to consider the case of scholars who complete their defence by 2nd of August 2022 for award of Degrees in the 10th convocation.

	<p>In the 44th Senate, the Senate approved that a student covered under 2020 B. Tech curriculum may earn a specialization from the parent department upon completion of 4 courses (16 credits) from the single vertical/specialization prescribed by the department. The students have also been granted an alternate option to earn a Minor from the other department if one completes 3 courses (12 credits) as prescribed by that department.</p> <p>In the 46th Senate, the Senate approved the guidelines concerning Minor and Specialization of B.Tech program.</p> <p>The Institute has recently recruited faculty in the Bio-medical/Biotechnology streams and it is proposed to offer Minor in Bioengineering.</p> <p>The guidelines approved by the Senate for offering Minor program stipulate for carrying out a need analysis by the department along with brainstorming session with industry/academic experts.</p> <p>In case of need analysis, it is observed that the minor program aims to apply engineering principles to analyze, solve and innovate devices and solutions for computational problems in the field of biology, medicine and healthcare. It may kindly be noted that among the enlisted courses, Biomedical Instrumentation and Sensors in Healthcare have already been approved by the Senate in its 47th meeting and other courses requires the consent of the Senate.

It is also proposed to offer these courses as free elective from the Dept. of Sciences and Humanities for the benefit of interested students.

A copy of Minutes of the Brainstorming session and details of courses to be offered are placed as **Annexure F**.

Senate may kindly consider and approve the proposal of offering Minor in Bioengineering by the Department of Sciences and Humanities along with approval for basket of courses proposed by the department.

The Senate noted the proposal and observed that the Minor program may be offered to all UG students without any prerequisite. In case of requirement of any expertise, the same may suitably be included in the basket of electives. The eligibility condition of minimum CGPA of 8.5 was discussed and the Senate, to encourage multi-disciplinary profile, decided to reduce the CGPA level to 8.0 to attract more students.

With the above amendments, the Senate approved the proposal of offering Minor program in Bioengineering by the Department of Sciences and Humanities.

II. Modified Elective:

In the 38th Senate, an elective Course “Materials Fabrication and Characterization Techniques (PHY 506) was approved as 3 credit course. During the recent review, it was decided to incorporate tutorial hours in the course which include lab visits and hands on experiments which are beneficial for the student. On account of addition of tutorial hours, it is proposed to change the course from a 3 credit to a 4 credit course. A review by external expert was conducted and the external expert committee has recommended for revision in the course credit.

In addition, the credit in respect of “Antenna Theory and Design” (ELE514) is also proposed for revision from 3 credit course to 4 credit course based on internal

departmental review and the credit in respect of “Machine Learning” (COM510) is also proposed for revision from 3 credit course to 4 credit course.

The Senate took note of new and modified elective courses proposed by the Institute. In case of Applied Linear Algebra for Communications, Signal Processing and Machine Learning, the Senate advised the Institute to change the course as “Applied linear Algebra”. In case of Modified electives, it was decided to offer the courses to UG/PG students only.

The Senate, after deliberation, approved the two new courses and three modified elective courses.

Request for Repeating from First Semester

A request has been received from Ms. Madhavi Dantuluri M/o Instiute student Sh. Arun Varma Dantuluri (CS20B1008) for repeating from first semester on account of his poor performance. In this regard, the following is submitted for kind perusal of the Senate:

- 1) The student joined the B.Tech program in Computer Science and Engineering in the year 2020 under DASA category.
- 2) The student has so far completed 4 semesters. However, his performance is not satisfactory and the details are as under:

As per Ordinance concerning minimum requirement to continue the programme (R.8.0 and R.8.1 A) “a student should earn not less than 10 credits in the first semester, and 26 credits at the end of the second semester. Thereafter he must maintain an average of 14 credits per semester including first two semesters to continue his studies. However, in the final semester a student may earn less than 14 credits if it is sufficient for him to fulfill the requirements for the award of the degree. If a

student fails to earn credits every semester, as stated above, his/ her name will be struck off the rolls at the end of the semester”.

In addition, the student earns a minimum CGPA of 5.0 calculated for the courses successfully completed at the end of each semester. (R.8.3).

However, on account of Covid, no adverse action was taken and at present a request has been received to repeat the course from first semester.

As per ordinance (R9.1) students are permitted to complete the program at a slower pace by taking more time but in any case, not more than 12 semesters excluding semester withdrawn or on medical grounds.

In view of the above and also taking into account future prospects of the student, Senate may kindly consider to grant permission in case of Sh. Arun Varma Dantuluri(CS20B1008) to repeat his B.Tech program in Computer Science and Engineering from first semester commencing from July-November 2022 semester. The student is required to pay the requisite fee for all the semesters besides fulfilling the credit/CGPA requirement.

The Senate approved the request of Sh. Arun Varma Dantuluri (CS20B1008) for repeating his B.Tech program in Computer Science and Engineering from first semester onwards as a special case with a condition that this shall not be treated as precedence for any future request. The student is required to pay the requisite fee for all the semesters besides fulfilling the credit/CGPA requirement. The performance of the student is to be reviewed at the end of first semester for further continuance of his studies. The Senate further advised the Institute to offer specialized counselling to the student throughout his study period.

Request for Repeating from Third Semester

Another request has been received from Ms. Nimmagadda Naga Sai Pranathi (EC20B1075) for repeating her B.Tech program from third semester on medical ground. In this regard, the following is submitted for perusal of the Senate:

- 1) The student joined the B.Tech program in Electronics and Communication Engineering in the year 2020 and his JEE - AIR is 26944
- 2) The student has so far completed 4 semesters. It is reported by the student that she was suffering from Viral Pneumonia and Post Covid Sequelae in May 2021 and was advised by the doctor for complete rest for a period of one year. A doctor certificate in this regard has been submitted by the student. Due to severe illness, the student could not able to attend the online classes. Her performance during the period is as under:

As per Ordinance concerning minimum requirement to continue the programme, the student has fulfilled the requirement only in the first two semesters (R.8.0 and R.8.1 A).

As per ordinance (R9.1) students are permitted to complete the program at a slower pace by taking more time but in any case not more than 12 semesters excluding semester withdrawn or on medical grounds.

In view of the above and also taking into account future prospects of the student, Senate may kindly consider to grant permission in case of Ms. Nimmagadda Naga Sai Pranathi (EC20B1075) to repeat her B. Tech program in Electronics and Communication Engineering from third semester along with her junior batch. This being on account of medical grounds and the student has already paid requisite fees for the 3rd and 4th semester; she may be permitted to repeat his 3rd and 4th semester without paying Institute/Hostel fees excluding advance dining charges. The student is required to fulfill the credit/CGPA requirement.

The Senate approved the request of Ms. Nimmagadda Naga Sai Pranathi (EC20B1075) for repeating her B.Tech program in Electronics and Communication Engineering from third semester onwards as a special case, on account of her medical condition, with a stipulation that this shall not be treated as precedence for any future request. The student may be permitted to repeat his 3rd and 4th semester without paying Institute/Hostel fees excluding advance dining charges. The performance of the student is to be reviewed at the end of third semester for further continuance of her studies. The Senate further advised the Institute to offer specialized counselling to the student throughout her study period.

	<p>The institute has signed a MoU with M/s.Saint-Gobain on 08.07.2022 and in line with the provisions of MoU, M/s. Saint-Gobain will award scholarship to Girl students to encourage them to seek admission, pursue the course and make a career, especially from those who have the aspiration but do not have adequate economic backing.</p> <p>The scholarship will be provided for maximum of five B.Tech students per batch every year. The Scholarship will be equivalent to the Tuition fee payable to the Institute at the commencement of the academic program. The parental annual income of the student shall be lower than Rs. 10,00,000 (INR Ten Lakhs), as certified by the appropriate Government authority.</p> <p>An academic panel constituted by the Director, IIITDM Kancheepuram with at least two Professors and one member from M/s. Saint-Gobain shall identify the students for scholarship. Scholarship for 1st years admission will be among the top 25 toppers in the JEE Rank list admitted to the Institute subject to eligible annual Income. In the subsequent years, Scholarship will be for the top five girl students with highest academic score (based on their previous year examinations with minimum CGPA 9) subject to parental income limit.
