This resulted in students being away from the campus for a long period. In order to overcome this, minor modifications proposed by the Institute were considered by the Senate.

As the 7 <sup>th</sup> semester has only Electives, Depts. #### Approval for Syllabi of DD Course Curriculum of Department of CSE

The Senate was informed of the approval accorded by the Senate in its 51<sup>st</sup> meeting for offering a Dual Degree program by the Department of Computer Science and Engineering. In the said meeting, the Senate advised the Institute to place a detailed syllabus of the course curriculum of the DD program.

In line with the advice of the Senate, the syllabus for the core courses to be offered in the  $7^{th}$  and  $8^{th}$  semesters were placed for consideration by the Senate as "**Annexure F**":

The Senate, after perusal, suggested prescribing at least 2 textbooks for the courses to be offered by the Institute. The Senate further approved the syllabus of all six core courses of the DD program of the Department of CSE.

#### **Grant of Medical Leave to Scholars**

It was informed that in the 54th meeting of the Senate, an agenda concerning the enhancement of fellowships to PhD scholars was placed for approval by the Senate. As per the MoE order dated 11.09.2023, this enhancement is subject to certain service conditions like leave wherein it is provided that the scholars are eligible for only 8 days of casual leave. This proposal was considered and approved by the Senate with the above service conditions. After this, a request was made for a grant of 15 days of vacation leave in the 55<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Senate and the same was approved by the Senate after due consideration.

Subsequent to this, several requests were received by the Department Academic and Research Committees (DARC) from the scholars for a grant of medical leave. In this regard, it was submitted to the Senate that the scholars have only a limited number of CLs and in case of a medical emergency, they are exhausting all available leave and the balance period is treated as an absence. Grant of medical leave by institutions like IIT to the extent of 10-30 days was informed to the Senate.

Given the above, a request was made to the Senate to permit the scholars to avail 15 days of medical leave in a year with a stipulation that the leave will be granted based on certification from the medical officer and without carry forward. The scholars are eligible for HTRA during the leave period.

The Senate took note of the request and also the practice followed by other institutions. The Senate opined that there is a requirement for leave to meet any medical emergency, however, the scholar shall not be away from their regular research work for a long time.

The Senate, after deliberation, decided to club both vacation leave and medical leave request together and approved granting 22 days of leave in a year to meet medical and other considerations without any carryforward. In case of leave exceeding 3 days on account of medical reasons, the leave shall be granted based on certification from an authorized medical officer. The scholars are eligible for HTRA during the leave period. The period, exceeding the maximum stipulated period of leave, shall be treated as an absence period.

#### Discontinuation of Execution of Indemnity Bond by the Scholars/M. Tech Students

It was informed that in the 47<sup>th</sup> meeting, the Senate approved the proposal of collecting, an affidavit cum indemnity bond from PG/Ph.D. scholars at the time of their admission with a stipulation that in case of discontinuance of their studies, the students are to refund 50% of their fellowship amount or Rs.1.00 lakh whichever is lower. These norms were approved to ensure that the scholars with a commitment to research only join the program during the pandemic period.

It was also informed that all the students are, at present, available on the campus and accordingly the proposal of the Institute to discontinue the practice of seeking indemnity bonds from scholars and M.Tech students with immediate effect was placed for approval of the Senate. It was also proposed that in cases where students have already executed the bond, the relief request shall be examined and granted based on recommendations of the duly constituted committee.

The Senate, after deliberation, approved the proposal of discontinuation of seeking indemnity bonds with immediate effect. In cases where students have already executed the bond, the relief request shall be granted based on the recommendations of the committee constituted by the Dean (Academic Affairs) and approved by the Chairman Senate.
