After detailed discussions the committee resolved to include CEED score as part of the eligibility criterion for M.Des in addition to the existing GATE score criterion. M.Des Admissions 2011 will require students to have appeared in GATE/CEED examinations.

- A.4 To approve the introduction of new elective courses.

Resolution Courses on Smart Materials & Applications, Principles of Economics and Design
No. History are being introduced as electives for UG/PG/Ph.D students. The detailed
10/2010 syllabus was submitted for the AAC's approval. The committee discussed the contents in detail and approved the introduction of the elective courses. The AAC recommended to have a COT criterion for Smart Materials and Applications course which has been adopted. (Annexure I)

A.5 To approve the syllabus of M.Des curriculum - Electronic Systems and Mechanical Systems.

Resolution No. 11/2010 Detailed Syllabus of M.Des curriculum (Electronic Systems & Mechanical Systems) was submitted to the AAC for its discussion and approval. The AAC after extensive discussion approved the M.Des syllabus for Electronic Systems and Mechanical Systems. (Annexure II)

A.6 To approve the proposed categorization of courses and the revised grade card model of the Institute

Resolution No. 12/2010 Further to the changes in curricula and attendance regulations, the institute proposed to revise the grade card issued to students with simplified categorization of courses. The AAC after discussions resolved to approve the proposed model and categorization of courses as given below:

The AAC also resolved to approve the proposed grade card model of detailing only the current semester performance in semester-wise grade sheets and indicating the overall performance in all semesters in the Consolidated Statement of Grades. (Annexure III)

A.7 To approve the proposed Memorandums of Understanding (MoU) with University of Genova, University of Catania and SAMEER, Chennai

Resolution No. 13/2010 MoUs facilitating collaborative research, technology development and knowledge exchange involving faculty/scientists and student members were submitted to the AAC for recommendation to the Board. The terms and conditions concerning the proposed Memorandums of Understanding with University of Genova and University of Catania, Italy and SAMEER, Chennai (Ministry of IT, Govt. of India)

were submitted for the AAC's consideration. The AAC recommended the proposed MOU's to the Board for its approval. (Annexure IV)

A.8 To consider enhancement of honorarium for guest faculty and experts delivering guest lectures

Resolution No. 14/2010 Further to the enhancement in the rates of honorarium by IIT Madras for guest faculty and experts delivering guest lectures, the Institute submitted a proposal of revision of honorarium similar to IIT Madras norms (Annexure V). The AAC considered the proposal and recommended to the Board for its approval.

A.9 To approve the proposed mechanism of imparting communication skills to the students.

Resolution No. 15/2010 Subsequent to the changes in the UG curricula, the AAC approved the proposal to exempt the students admitted to the Institute from appearing in the English Proficiency Test, taking into account the fact that a course INT104 English for Communication is offered in the 2nd Semester. The AAC also approved the Institute's proposal to allow only needy PG/Ph.D students as assessed and identified by the Research Supervisor / Faculty Advisor to audit the INT 104 English for Communication course.
