	It was submitted to the Senate that the Institute is in receipt of a letter from the Ministry of Education dated 13 <sup>th</sup> September 2023 regarding the enhancement of fellowship (HTRA) to research scholars. The enhancement is effective from 01.01.2023 and the details are as under:

	<p>A copy of the MoE letter dated 13.09.2023 was placed as <b>Annexure “C”</b>.</p> <p>It was intimated that the enhancement of HTRA to PhD scholars shall be applicable from 01.01.2023. The terms and conditions mentioned in the MoE letter will be applicable to all PhD scholars of the Institute for the receipt of fellowship. It was also intimated that the Institute is in the process of releasing the enhanced amount from the current month and the arrears will be released subsequently.</p> <p>Accordingly, the Senate was requested to consider and approve the enhancement of HTRA as per the directions of the MoE.</p> <p><b><i>The Senate, after deliberation, approved the enhancement of HTRA in line with provisions of the MoE letter dated 13.09.2023.</i></b></p>																														
<p><b>2023-54-Senate-05</b></p>	<p><b>Request for revival of registration in case of an External Scholar</b></p>																														
	<p>It was submitted to the Senate that Mr S Pratap Raj was admitted as an external scholar (working in Sapient) in the SIDI department in August 2022 admission. The scholar successfully completed his coursework during the semester period. However, the scholar subsequently has not enrolled for the Jan-May 23 semester and also has not paid the required fees in spite of reminders. Therefore, with the approval of the competent authority, his registration was cancelled vide OM. dated 15.05.2023.</p> <p>The Senate was further informed about the request of the scholar for the revival of his registration and his submission that the non-enrolment is on account of medical reasons and his willingness to settle the pending dues was intimated to the Senate.</p> <p>As the scholar is interested in pursuing his doctoral program, the Senate was requested to approve for revival of his registration.</p> <p><b><i>The Senate, after deliberation, approved the revival of the PhD registration of Mr. S Pratap Raj. Further, the Senate granted an extension of 6 months to complete his comprehensive viva voce examination. The Chairman, Senate has urged the supervisors to interact with their External and RKA PhD Scholars on a regular basis and to report any lacuna in this to the PIC Research/Dean Academic Affairs. Further, the semester registration data of PhD scholars should be shared with the respective supervisors to enable any necessary follow up actions.</i></b></p>

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	<p>The details of the above courses were also placed in Annexure “D” and the Senate was requested to approve the modified elective courses.</p> <p><i>The Senate, after deliberation, approved the five modified elective courses. These courses are to be offered from the January 2024 semester onwards.</i></p>												
<p><b>2023-54-Senate-07</b></p>	<p><b>Branch transfer from B.Tech to unfilled seats of Dual Degree Program</b></p>												
	<p>It was submitted to the Senate that as per extant rules of Ordinance (R.5.0) and approval of the Senate, the branch transfer from B.Tech to B.Tech as well as Dual Degree (DD) is permitted.</p> <p>In the case of a Dual degree, the transfer from only DD to DD is permitted. Initially, such transfer (B.Tech to B.Tech and DD to DD) was permitted at the end of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester for the B.Tech students, however, subsequent to a change in curriculum, such transfer has been permitted at the end of the first semester (2021-44-Senate-07). On account of this provision, there will be 2 vacant seats in the DD program offered by the Dept. of CSE.</p> <p>In view of the above and also grant benefits to students, the proposal of the institute to grant branch transfer from B.Tech to the DD program in case of availability of any unfilled seats after completion of DD to DD branch transfer at the end of the first semester was placed for approval of the Senate. It was also submitted that the existing scheme of branch transfer from B.Tech to DD program, at the end of the third year, will continue to be carried out in line with the provisions of the Ordinance.</p> <p><i>The Senate, after deliberation, approved the branch transfer from B.Tech to Dual Degree, at the end of the first semester, in case of availability of any vacant seats in DD programs after regular branch transfer among Dual degrees.</i></p>	S.No	Name of the DD Program	Approved Intake	01. 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<p><b>2023-54-Senate-08</b></p>	<p><b>Pre-doctoral Fellowship to scholars to encourage continuation of research after submission of thesis</b></p>												
	<p>The Senate was informed that as per extant provisions, HTRA fellowship is granted to scholars till the date of submission of thesis work.</p> <p>In certain cases, it is noticed that the scholars complete their thesis work well in advance i.e. before the completion of 5-year period. In most of these cases, there is a scope for additional</p>												

	<p>publication of research papers/patents, however, in the absence of any financial incentive, the scholar leaves the institute after submission of their thesis work.</p> <p>In order to encourage the scholars to continue their research work at the institute, the proposal to award the fellowship to scholars, who submit their thesis work before the completion of 5 years, till their completion of Viva-voce or completion of 5-year period from enrolment whichever is earlier, as pre-doctoral fellowship. Further, this fellowship will be granted based on certification from the supervisor and HoD to the effect that this additional period will lead to the publication of a paper/patent.</p> <p>Accordingly, the Senate was requested to approve the proposal of providing a pre-doctoral fellowship to scholars.</p> <p><b><i>The Senate, after deliberation, approved the proposal of granting pre-doctoral fellowships to scholars till their completion of Viva-voce or completion of a 5-year period from enrolment, whichever is earlier, so as to encourage the continuation of research after the submission of their thesis.</i></b></p>
<p><b>2023-54-Senate-09</b></p>	<p><b>Financial Assistance to Ph.D. Scholars for attending reputed International Conferences</b></p>
	<p>It was informed to the Senate that the Institute is receiving multiple requests from scholars for financial support for their participation in reputed international conferences held outside the country. It is also observed that IITs and other Institutes of national importance extend support to scholars in this regard.</p> <p>It was further submitted to the Senate that the MoE vide their letter dated 13.09.2023 on the subject of revision of HTRA to PhD scholars mentioned that</p> <p><i>“In order to further enhance value, quality and experience in doctoral research, the proposal to incentivize research output will be considered separately and modalities for its implementation will be evolved.”</i></p> <p>Accordingly, in order to add value and quality and also to incentivize and encourage their research output in the reputed international conference, the proposal of the Institute to provide financial support to participate in reputed International conferences held abroad was placed for approval of the Senate. Under the proposal, the Institute may grant financial support up to a maximum of Rs. 60,000 to Rs.1,00,000/ (based on Region) to all regular HTRA research scholars excluding scholars registered under NHTRA, Part-time, External; Project, and PEE categories. The scholars will be permitted to utilize the amount for participation in only one conference during the tenure of their program. The expenditure will be met from the internal resources of the Hostel Fund (Student corpus).</p> <p>The detailed eligibility and other conditions governing the proposal were placed as Annexure “E”</p> <p><b>The Senate, after deliberation, approved the proposal of granting financial assistance to Ph.D. Scholars for attending international conferences.</b></p> <p><b>The Senate further advised the Institute to permit the scholars to book the flight tickets directly from the airlines’ websites or through other agencies so that they can avail cheapest rates. Chairman Senate urged that the scholars should submit proposals for travel grant from the funding agencies. The Senate advised that the list of funding agencies should be included in the guidelines for easy reference by the scholars and accordingly, the revised guidelines are given in Annexure “E”.</b></p>

	<p>The Senate was informed that the institute is following continuous evaluation of the performance of students and accordingly, the evaluation is carried out by way of Q1/Q2/end sem. examination. In certain courses, a mid-sem. exam is conducted followed by the end sem. examination.</p> <p>In order to prescribe a uniform pattern for the evaluation of students, the proposal of the Institute, as detailed below, was placed for consideration by the Senate:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Mid-semester Examination (MSE): 25-30%</li> <li>(ii) Continuous Evaluation Scheme (CES): 25-30%</li> <li>(iii) End-semester Examination (ESE): 40-50%</li> </ul> <p>The CES component will be comprising any suitable combination of surprise tests, homework assignments, mini-projects, term papers, student seminars, etc.</p> <p>It was also intimated that the academic calendar is formulated in line with the above scheme. In the case of design courses, as the focus is more on experiential learning, the proposal to follow the current system of evaluation (70% CES and 30% ESE) was informed to the Senate.</p> <p>Accordingly, the Senate was requested to approve the adoption of a uniform pattern for the assessment of students.</p>
	<p><i>The Senate, after deliberation, approved the revised assessment scheme preferably with MSE (25%), CES (25%) and ESE (50%).</i></p> <p><i>In the case of the current assessment pattern of SIDI, the Senate suggested to have CES of 50-60% and ESE of 40-50% so that a comprehensive evaluation of all the concepts learnt throughout the course can be done in the end semester examination. Chairman, Senate advised the Head, SIDI to deliberate in the department and report to the Senate in its next meeting.</i></p>

	<p>The academic calendar for the semester period Jan- May 2024 and July-Nov. 2024 prepared by the Institute was placed as an <b>Annexure “F”</b> for the kind perusal of the Senate.</p> <p>The January session commences on 17<sup>th</sup> January and ends on 10<sup>th</sup> of May 2024. The July session commences on the 12<sup>th</sup> of August 2023 and ends on the 4<sup>th</sup> of December,2024.</p> <p>The Senate was requested to approve the academic calendar for the two-semester periods in the year 2024 along with the delegation of powers to the Chairman Senate for making corrections if any.</p>
	<p><i>The Senate approved the academic calendar for the year 2024.</i></p> <p><i>The Senate further delegated the power to the Chairman Senate to carry out any modification in the calendar in case of any delay/advancement in the admission/physical reporting process during the year 2024 and the revised calendar will be placed before the Senate in its next meeting for ratification.</i></p>

	<p>It was submitted to the Senate that in the 46<sup>th</sup> meeting and 52<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the Senate, the Senate deliberated on the courses to be taken by the scholars in the SIDI and advised the institute to review the proposal.</p> <p>Based on the suggestion of the Senate, the matter was reviewed internally and the SIDI has reiterated the proposal of offering 2 courses in design viz. Design Research – Theory &amp; Methods as a compulsory core course and Concept &amp; Exploration Project as a Pass/Fail course for all scholars. These scholars will not be doing the Research Methodology course which is a mandatory pass/fail course for other scholars and against this, SIDI scholars will enroll for Concept Exploration Project as a Pass/Fail course. *The Senate took note of the admission status of the M.Tech program during the year 2023-24. As admission to M.Tech programs is not at a satisfactory level, the Senate advised the departments to deliberate internally on the relevance of current programs and the modalities for enhancing admission. The Senate further advised the Institute to explore various possibilities including offering a part-time M.Tech program for industry professionals and a joint program in collaboration with reputed institutes in India/abroad. **Grant of extension of time to Ph.D. Scholars who have completed 5 years period**
